My child said, "I don't feel safe, I'm scared!" I put my arm around my child and tried to give a warm comforting response, but we could only see the flashing lights.


As we were allowed to walk into the store, people were pointing out the bullet holes.

According to Homefacts.com (https://www.homefacts.com/city/Colorado/Jefferson-County/Lakewood.html#crime) the crime index shows that auto crime has increased nearly 300%!! The break-ins have increased 186%. Murder has gone up 152%.

As our city has drastically grown, our city has not kept pace with additional police protection for our increase in population. The state average is 2.93 police officers per 1,000 residents. In 2016, Lakewood had 1.78 officers per 1,000 residents.

We were told last year, that if we just gave our Tax Payer Bill of Rights refunds to the city, we would see more officers. According to city-data.com that hasn't happened.
